

One in Spirit / One in Mission

I hope anyone who counts themselves as a member, friend, parishioner or who is considering becoming one of the Church of the Epiphany faith community has, by now, had a chance to read our annual giving parish letter in which the One in Spirit / One in Mission theme guiding our 2017 Annual Giving conversation was introduced. This theme carries a richness of meaning and is grounded in Jesus' understanding of how we who love God, who love Jesus, are invited to live and move and have our being. Let's take a look at this theme a bit more deeply. In the Gospel of John, Jesus explores the concept of Oneness as he prays ... oneness between himself, God the Father, and those who are to be given the gift of the Holy Spirit, the Church.

"The glory that you have given me I have given them, so that they may be one, as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may become completely one ... "

John 17:22-23a

Does this mean that there are to be no distinctions between us? By no means and on the contrary, the more we discover who we individually are meant to be in God's life and love, the more capable we are of moving into the dance of oneness in the Spirit with others who travel the way with us.

There are many ways we, as members of the "Jesus movement" (Presiding Bishop Curry's designation for the Church) become more and more One in Spirit. We are called to worship, to listen deeply to scripture together, to play together, to be in honest relationship with one another, and to serve one another and those who are not and may never be part of our particular faith community ("the other").

We also intentionally discern God's call to us to give and receive as individuals and families and at all levels of our faith community. Individuals and families give and receive within the local faith community and then the leadership of the particular faith community gives and receives within our deanery, our diocese and beyond. We discover the gifts we have been given and how we are called to pledge those gifts... gifts of time, of talent, and of treasure to support God's mission. And then we support one another to do our best to meet our pledges. Pledges are not like taxes... they are not inflexible assessments. Rather, they are expressions of a combination of our loving and caring as well as our best guess at what we can realistically and faithfully offer. God knows that circumstances change even after we make commitments! There is never any shame in responsibly decreasing or increasing our pledge. Becoming contributing members, as we are able, of a faith community that is growing in oneness is a powerful way to honor the dignity of the life God has given us. The beauty of Christian community is that we never have to make these discernments and decisions alone for the blessings of true relatedness, honesty, mercy, care and peace are available as gifts of the Spirit.

We who are seeking to grow in Oneness as the Church of the Epiphany here in Royersford, Pennsylvania have committed to a mutual ministry that seeks to serve God, one another, and "the other". Together during this time of annual giving let us discover, name and pledge our gifts... and enter fully into the blessing of the dance.
